National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy — staffing	It was agreed to approve the following staffing arrangements for the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) Unit to support the administration of the NAPLAN program in Queensland: • a total of 10 staff for the business-as-usual staffing model for the NAPLAN Unit, including 4 of the current temporary AO7 positions • the cessation of the remaining 4 temporary positions from 30 June 2023.
