
7–10 Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS): Overview

Australian Curriculum Version 9.0

The Australian Curriculum identifies and organises the essential knowledge, understandings and skills that students should learn. This overview summarises the key elements of this learning area.

HASS subjects

The HASS learning area comprises five subjects. There is one subject in P–6 called Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS). In Years 7–10, the HASS learning area consists of four subjects: History, Geography, Civics and Citizenship and Economics and Business. This builds on the knowledge, understanding and skills learnt in the subject HASS. A separate subject overview is provided for the P–6 subject and for each Years 7–10 subject.



Concepts

Concepts underpin each subject in Humanities and Social Sciences. In P–6, these concepts are broad to encompass the essential content across History, Geography, Civics and Citizenship and Economics and Business. In Years 7–10, the concepts become more discipline-specific within each of the subjects.

Content descriptions

Content descriptions describe what is to be taught and what students are expected to learn. Content descriptions are organised through strands and sub-strands.

Knowledge and understanding strand

The Knowledge and understanding strand provides the contexts through which skills and understanding of the core concepts are developed in increasing complexity. Under each strand, curriculum content is further organised into sub-strands depending on the subject.
