They describe the features of familiar places and recognize that places can be represented on maps and models. They identify how their families and friends know about their past and commemorate events that are important to them.  Students respond to questions about their own past and places they belong to. They sequence familiar events in order. They observe the familiar features of places and represent these features and their location on pictorial maps and models. They reflect on their learning to suggest ways they can care for a familiar place. Students relate stories about their past and share and compare observations about familiar places.			By the end of Foundation, students identify significant people and events in their own lives, and how significant events are celebrated or commemorated. Students recognise the features of familiar places, why some places are special to people and the ways they can care for them.  Students pose questions, and sort and record information from observations and provided sources. They share a perspective and draw conclusions.
