This resource provides a sequence of achievement standards aspects, with related content descriptions, for Prep-Year 10 Visual Arts, organised by Responding and Making.

By breaking each achievement standard into discrete aspects and including content descriptions, the increasing complexity of the achievement standards can be seen across Prep–Year 10. This supports teachers to identify the knowledge, understanding and skills that come before and after the enrolled year level/band.

When planning teaching, learning and assessment, teachers can use this resource to:

- plan for the range of students within a single year level or band
- determine appropriate curriculum access points for all students
- better understand aspects of achievement standards through consideration of where they are introduced, their progression and where they conclude.
