Update to the Syllabuses application

Purpose

To advise that the updated Syllabuses application is now live in the QCAA Portal, and to provide a schedule for the release of redeveloped Applied syllabuses in the Syllabuses application.

Background

The Syllabuses application was launched in the QCAA Portal in 2018 to support schools to transition to the new Queensland Certificate of Education system. The application hosts all senior syllabuses and a range of syllabus implementation resources.

The QCAA has updated the Syllabuses application to improve functionality.

Information

The updated Syllabuses application can be accessed through the QCAA Portal and contains the same content as the previous version of the application. The redeveloped Applied syllabuses, to be implemented from 2024, will be added to the Syllabuses application in Term 3, 2023.

Schools will only be able to view syllabuses for those subjects with current student enrolments recorded in the Student Management application. Resources for the redeveloped and revised syllabuses will be added to the application progressively.

All users who have access to the existing application have been given automatic access to this version and a quick step user guide to the updated Syllabuses application is available via the Help button in the QCAA Portal.

All current syllabuses will still be available in the Syllabuses application and as PDFs on the QCAA website.
