Uploading and checking of student data

Thank you to all schools for uploading and checking their data. We have now closed this process off for 2016.

Handbook for principals

Small schools

Any small schools that currently do not have any students enrolled in Years 3, 5, 7 or 9, will still receive a delivery of test materials. The material will include *type 2 testbooks* (unnamed), which have the school name and details on them but are not be overprinted with the students' names. These materials are sent for two reasons. First, so that schools have testbooks should there be a new enrolment or a visiting student from another school needs to sit the test at the school, and second, so that teachers have copies of the materials to refer to or use later. If you do not use any of the materials, keep them secure until the 20 May but **please do not return them**.

NAPLAN materials

Specified items permitted in the NAPLAN tests are listed on page 20 of the 2016 Handbook for *Principals*, Section 8.6.9, and include:

- ✓ pencils or pens (as specified by the TAA)
- ✓ pencil sharpener
- ✓ eraser
- one blank piece of paper in the Language conventions test, which is to be collected by the test administrator at the end of the test
- one blank piece of paper for planning in the Writing test, which is to be collected by the test administrator at the end of the test
- one blank piece of paper for working in the Numeracy tests, which is to be collected by the test administrator at the end of the test
- calculators for the Years 7 and 9 Numeracy calculator-allowed tests

It is helpful in the scanning and marking of testbooks if students use an **HB** or darker pencil.

The use of **lighter grade pencils** or **pacers** is **not** permitted in the tests and can make the scanning and marking more difficult.

Schools are advised to provide spare pencils as required.

Other items <u>not</u> permitted include:

- Rulers
- O Coloured pens/pencils
- Felt pens
- Highlighters
- O Correction fluid
- Mobile phones, ipads or other devices, including Bluetooth devices
- Calculators (other than in the Year 7 and Year 9 calculator allowed papers
- Mechanical lead pencils, such as *pacers*, or pencils with a lighter grade than HB

NAPLAN online

The move towards NAPLAN online is expected to begin in Queensland for a small number of schools in 2017.
