Innovators

Students are innovators, introducing new ideas and using original and creative thinking, when they:

- experiment with media technologies to discover how they work or interact with each other
- create moving-image media products to elicit particular responses from target audiences
- select and use digital technologies in new ways that extend their project outcomes.

Film, Television & New Media generates opportunities for students to be innovators, entrepreneurs, lifelong learners and responsible global citizens.

Entrepreneurs

Students are entrepreneurs, finding opportunities and taking creative risks, when they:

- generate workable solutions to problems with location, talent or technologies
- seek out engagement with authentic audiences or contexts for production and use, such as film festivals or competitions
- collaborate with others to enhance project outcomes.

Lifelong learners

Students are self-motivated, curious, lifelong learners, when they:

- adjust their practices in response to changing or unfamiliar software or technologies
- select and use signs, symbols, codes and conventions in engaging or dynamic ways
- identify and organise resources required to undertake a project.

Responsible citizens

Students are responsible global citizens, who are aware of and understand the world around them, when they:

- assess production risks and operate safely and respectfully in physical spaces and with equipment
- develop skills working with authentic industry-standard tools and processes
- recognise copyright ownership of artists and in the reproduction and distribution of work.
