Task			
Create a training vlog that explains a particular breach of ethical behaviour in a workplace, chosen in consultation with your teacher. This training vlog is for employees using the intranet of a company/business of your choice.			
To complete this task, you must:			
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> explain the breach in ethical behaviour explain two or three ramifications of the breach explain one or two preventative measures for the breach explain ideas and information from familiar and unfamiliar texts; familiar texts in this topic are <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <i>Australian Human Rights Commission</i>, www.humanrights.gov.au <i>Queensland Government</i>, 'Code of conduct for the Queensland public service', www.forgov.qld.gov.au/code-conduct-queensland-public-service select content, language and textual elements to inform employees about the breach.
