- a) Analyse perspectives on the concept of secrecy in *Bleak House*.

- b) How does Dickens use satire in the novel to position readers?

### ***In Cold Blood* by Truman Capote**

- a) Analyse perspectives on the concept of justice in the novel.

**OR**

- b) To what effect does Capote use foreshadowing and flashbacks in *In Cold Blood*?

### ***King Lear* by William Shakespeare**

- a) Analyse perspectives on the concept of suffering in the play.

**OR**

- b) How does Shakespeare use nature as a setting in *King Lear* to position audiences?

### ***Mrs Dalloway* by Virginia Woolf**

- a) Analyse perspectives on the concept of education in the novel.

**OR**

- b) To what effect does Woolf use stream of consciousness as a narrative device in *Mrs Dalloway*?

***That Deadman Dance* by Kim Scott**

- a) Analyse perspectives on colonisation in the novel.

**OR**

- b) How does Scott use memory to position readers in *That Deadman Dance*?

***The Poisonwood Bible* by Barbara Kingsolver**

- a) Analyse perspectives on the concept of captivity in the novel.

**OR**

- b) To what effect does Kingsolver use biblical symbols to position readers in *The Poisonwood Bible*?

***The Quiet American* by Graham Greene**

- a) Analyse perspectives on the concept of betrayal in *The Quiet American*.

**OR**

- b) How does Greene use characterisation to juxtapose conflicting beliefs in the novel?

***The Tempest* by William Shakespeare**

- a) Analyse perspectives on the concept of forgiveness in *The Tempest*.

**OR**

- b) How does Shakespeare use humour to explore power in the play?
