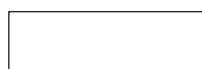

The pictures on this page raise a 21st century topic.

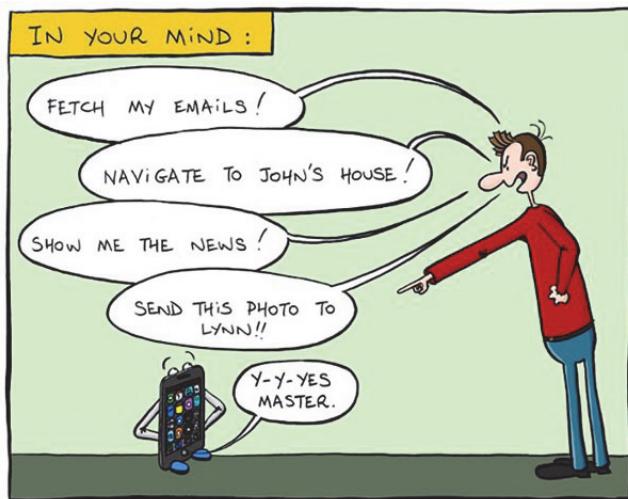
Write an argumentative article, in the affirmative or the negative, about this topic.

In your article, to be posted online:

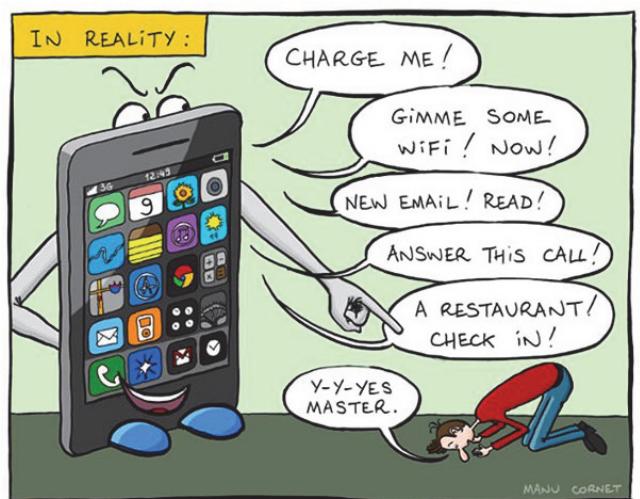
- provide a title that reflects your stand
